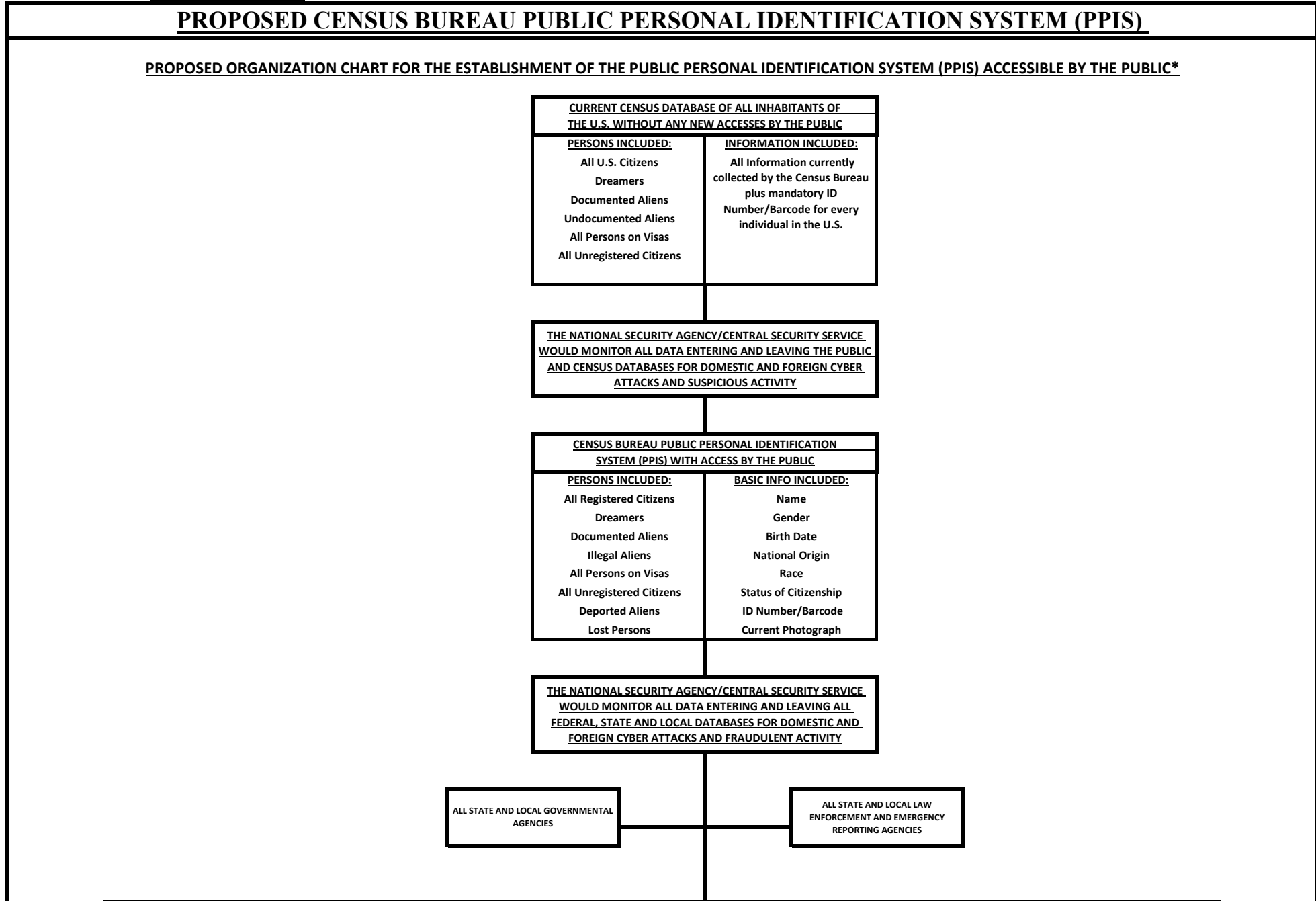

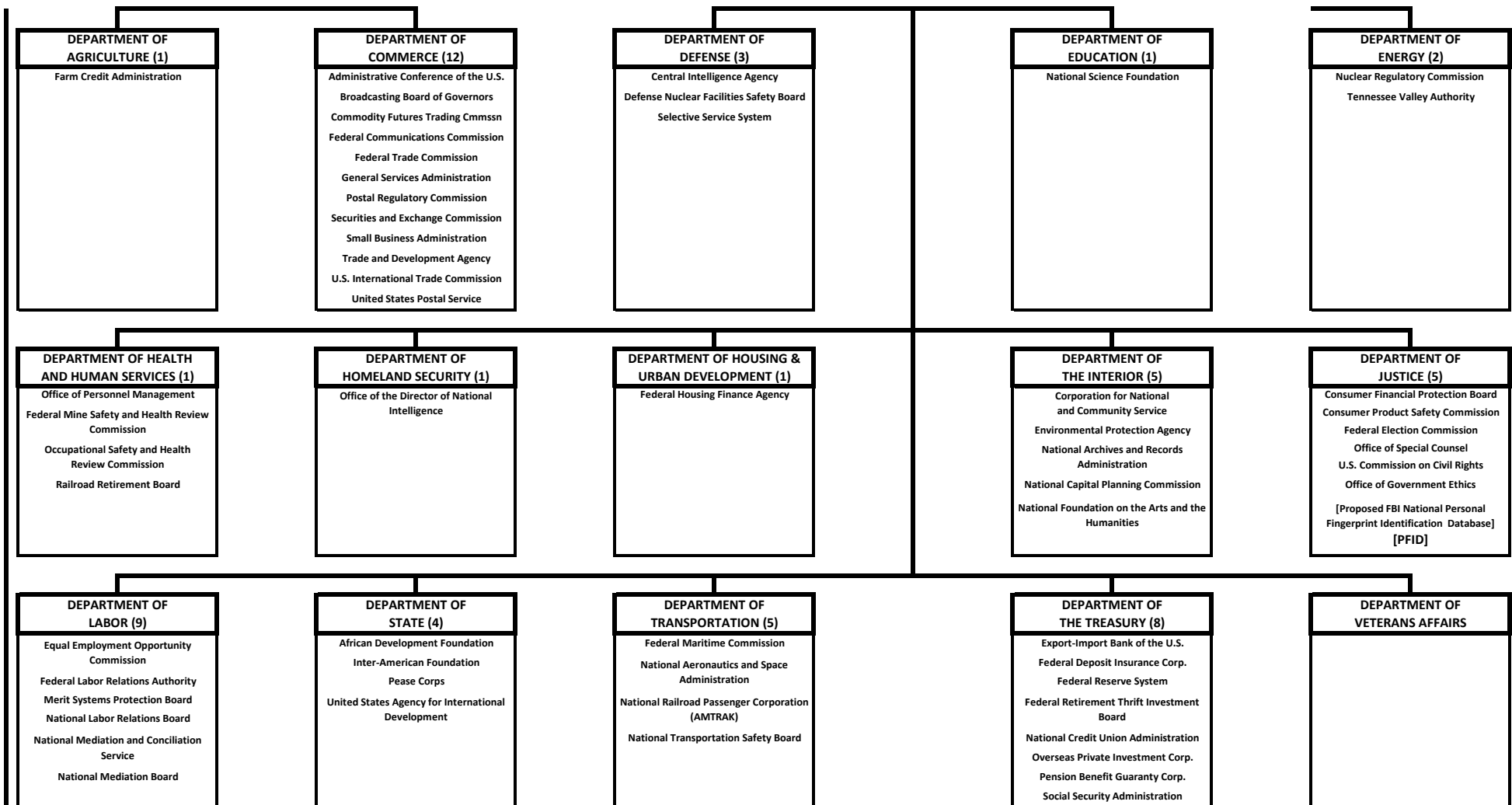

\*Note: A National Population ID Database accessible to the public can be accomplished by: (1) Establishing a national Public Personal Identification System (PPIS) in the Census Bureau to continuously validate and update the citizenship of the nation by assigning a unique ID Number/Barcode to every U.S. inhabitant; (2) Linking each ID Number/Barcode in the PPIS to a secure Personal Fingerprint Identification Database (PFID) at the FBI to positively identify every inhabitant of the U.S. to combat and prevent identity theft and provide a secure means of protecting and validating databases and flagging known criminals; (3) Using the database to monitor immigration, identify criminal activity and track household relocations within the borders of the nation by making it accessible to the public and law enforcement; (3) Supplementing the PPIS with very active databases from other agencies, such as Homeland Security, the FBI, Immigration, and correctional facilities to flag suspicious individuals for immediate detection; and (4) Discontinuing the current practice of the National Security Agency/Central Security Service (NSA/CSS) of archiving the phone records and raw internet traffic of millions of Americans without any evidence that they have been involved in any criminal activity, and instead, use the NSA/CSS to monitor all data entering and leaving the federal, state, and local databases for domestic and foreign cyber attacks and fraudulent activity. Since the public would have access to the PPIS, the information provided in this database, along with additional input from over 300 million pairs of eyes and ears, would make it very difficult for many illegal activities to thrive for very long inside the nation. To gain full participation in the implementation of the program nationwide, there would be rules and procedures to help fugitives repair their lives if they surrender. and a way to evaluate all illegal aliens and provide a fair and consistent path to citizenship for those who qualify. Credit bureaus, credit card companies, and other civilian organizations would be held accountable for the accuracy and confidentiality of their databases on citizens. Newborn babies would be mandated to be added to the database and they would be given their unique ID Number/Code and fingerprinted when they became old enough; deaths would be mandated to be removed from the database; and citizens would be mandated to update their address information when they moved to a new permanent location. This would allow the PPIS to be used to accomplish the reapportionment of the House of Representatives every ten years. The database would be continuously validated and updated through direct citizen involvement, law enforcement involvement, and the monitoring by the NSA/CSS. The unique ID Number/Code would be used on all driver's licenses, credit cards, and other forms of identification, and fingerprint identification machines would be installed at airports, sporting events, gun shows, theaters, etc., to expedite the entry process and quickly identify individuals who have been flagged by law enforcement. Citizens would be able to use the database to immediately notify law enforcement of any suspicious activity by use of their cell phones. Family members would be able to use the database to notify law enforcement or first responders when there is conflict, an emergency, or suspicious activity in the family. Citizens would have the ability to identify and verify persons who are contacting them for any purpose and help law enforcement to identify and dismantle scams against citizens. Photographs would be updated every 10 years or when there is a significant change in appearance.
